

NOTICE OF PRIMARY ELECTION

From the office of County Clerk, Dodge County, Nebraska

Notice is hereby given that on Tuesday, May 13, 2014, at the following polling places in the precincts of Dodge County, Nebraska, an election will be held. The polls will open at 8:00 A.M. and will close at 8:00 P.M.

Said election will be held for nominating, or in some cases, electing candidates to various offices.

In certain races for nominations to the General Election ballot, where the names of the candidates properly filed for election do not exceed two candidates for nonpartisan races and one for certain political races for each vacancy to be filled, all so filed shall be declared automatically nominated and no primary election will be held for that race.

City of Fremont voters will consider two proposals: Proposal Number 1 to adopt the 2014 Economic Development Plan which will be in effect until June 1, 2029 and Proposal Number 2 to consider the continuation of the one-half of one percent sales and use tax until September 30, 2024. Voters in Pebble Township will vote to consider an increase in the restricted funds base on their budget by 50% over the allowable growth percentage applicable to the lid on restricted funds. Village of Winslow voters will vote to consider allowing a levy on property taxes not to exceed \$1.05 per one hundred dollars of taxable valuation in excess of the limits prescribed by law for a period through fiscal year 2018-2019. Village of Dodge voters will consider voting on establishing and conducting a lottery within the village limits. The exact wording of these proposals is available for public inspection at my office and will be on the Sample Ballots when published at a date closer to the election. The above serves as notice of proposals that will be on the Primary Election ballot.

Nebraska's Primary Election is commonly known as a "closed primary". Only voters registered to a party may vote on their parties' nominees with the exceptions explained in the following paragraph for nonpartisan voters. To vote for a race of a certain party in the Primary, you have to be registered as a member of that party. Of course, all voters will be allowed to vote on the nonpartisan races and in the General Election, you may vote for any party candidates. The deadline to change parties for the Primary Election is May 2, 2014.

Two things new have happened with this Primary Election. Legislative Bill 56e passed this year with an emergency clause which made county official races automatically nominated to the General Ballot if there are no more than one candidate per party. In addition, for some time now, nonpartisan voters because they are U.S. Citizens, courts and legislation have ruled that they may vote for federal races of the party candidates of their choice. State law allows state parties to extend that beyond federal races. The State Democratic and Libertarian parties have allowed their entire ballot opened to nonpartisan voters. The Republican Party still only allows nonpartisan voters to vote on the federal races, U.S. Senate and House of Representative races. A nonpartisan registered voter must ask for this additional special ballot.
